An opportunity for volunteers to live and work in a biological research and education centre on the Pacific Costa Rican beach reserve of Playa Tortuga. Playa Tortuga is located just 3.5 hours from San Jose, in Ojochal de Osa on the Southern Pacific Coast Of Costa Rica. The Reserve offers an ideal environment for researchers and volunteers. It is located in the tropical rainforest and just outside of Marino Ballena National Park.

Dates

You can join for 1 week up to 12 weeks all year round.

Requirements

You should be 18 years old and over, physically fit, healthy and have a strong interest in conservation. You should also speak English, and Spanish (even basic) would also be useful.

Cost

The cost for 1 week is £440, 2 weeks cost is £687, 3 weeks is £932, 4 weeks is £1178, 5 weeks is £1381, 6 weeks is £1619, 7 weeks is £1856, 8 weeks is £2093, 9 weeks is £2330, 10 weeks is £2568, 11 weeks is £2805 and 12 weeks is £3042. This cost includes private, clean and spacious room, three meals a day, non-alcoholic beverage and snacks, equipment (for patrols), guide during the volunteering, back up and support.
